

## Caries Epidemiology & Prevalence




- Most common chronic disease affecting US children
  - 16 % of US children experience untreated dental disease
- 5 times more common than asthma.
- 7 times more common than hay fever.

#### **Illinois Caries Prevalence**



- 55% of the 3rd-graders have had dental caries experience (includes treated and 30% untreated cavities).
  - 3% needed to see a dentist urgently due to pain, abscess, or swelling.
- Only 33% of children enrolled in Medicaid/SCHIP utilize oral healthcare services .
- The number of Medicaid children who utilize services is highest among 4-5 year olds, & <u>lowest</u> among aged 0 to 3 years

#### **Pregnant Women**



- Hormonal changes cause changes in response to plaque in mouth
- Gingivitis 25-75% of pregnant women
  - Tender or bleeding gums
- Periodontitis— 15% of pregnant women
  - Few early symptoms, can lead to tooth loss
  - Associated with Pre-term birth
- Increase risk of Caries

#### **Link between Mom and Baby**




- Caries in children are caused by bacteria
- Vertically transmitted from caregiver to infant
  - Sharing utensils, "cleaning" pacifier with mouth etc.






Window of infectivity is first two years of life



#### Risk Factor: Frequent exposure



# **Prevention Strategies: Pregnant Women**



- Emphasis on self-care
  - Regular tooth brushing and flossing
  - Good diet
  - Drink TAP water
  - Their oral health can effect their baby
- Refer to the dentist
  - Yes! It is safe and recommended!
  - Only 26-34% of pregnant women visit the dentist

## Medicaid Dental Benefit: Pregnant women and adults



- Pregnant women are eligible for a minimum of:
  - An exam
  - Cleaning
  - Treatment of Periodontitis
  - PLUS all adult dental services
- Additional coverage will depend on Managed Care plan
- Contact DentaQuest at 888/286-2447 or a managed care plan for referral

## **Prevention Strategies: Infants and Young Children**



- Emphasize self-care for mother & family
  - Brushing, flossing and dental visit
- Begin tooth brushing as soon as teeth erupt
- Refer to dental home at age 1
- Drink Tap water or use nursery water with fluoride
- Do not put child to bed with anything but water in the bottle

### Medicaid Dental Benefit: Infants and Children



- Dental Exam every 6 months
- Extractions
- Fluoride varnish
- Root canals
- X-Rays
- Crowns
- Cleanings
- Fillings
- Sealants
