





WIC MIS DOCUMENTATION UPDATED LAB SCREEN


LAB Screen




Policy Review: Certification Standards Section 13.3

Section 13.3 – Immunization Screening and Referral

- WIC's role related to infant and child immunization status is to screen & refer:
 - **Screen**: Check the immunization status of infants and children during certification and recertification.
 - Refer: Direct families to health care providers or clinics when immunizations are due or missing.
- Must use a documented record.
- Immunization records are requested for infants and children during the certification and health screening process; however, immunization records are not required to obtain WIC services.

Immunization Screening



Choice	When to Use
Current	If a documented record is reviewed and status is current
Not Current	If a documented record is reviewed and status is not current
Record not Available	If a documented record is not available, verbal immunization status is not acceptable



Use this guide to determine what Action is needed based on the Status that was chosen.

If caregiver indicates status is current but documentation is not available, it is appropriate to indicate No Action Needed and add a note in the Notes column indicating this information.





Section 13.4 – Blood Lead Screening


- WIC's role in lead exposure prevention and reduction is to screen and refer.
- As part of the WIC Assessment, all WIC applicants must be asked if they've had a blood lead test within the past 12 months.
 - If yes, staff should include the results in WIC MIS and offer education and counseling as appropriate.
- If a child has not received a blood lead test, they must be referred to their healthcare provider or other program to obtain one.



Women & Infants	5 ug/dL or higher			
Children	3.5 ug/dL or higher			
If the above values chosen, risk would assign				

Lead result can be verbal, documentation is not required



Lead Screening

Choice	When to Use
Yes	If a test has been completed in the last 12 months
No	If a test has not been completed in the last 12 months
Unknown	If it is unknown whether a lead test has been completed in the last 12 months



Lead Test in Past 12 Months?	Value	Action
Yes	5 ug/dL or higher3.5 ug/dL or higher	Referral Provided and DocumentedNo Action Needed
Yes	5 ug/dL or less3.5 ug/dL or less	No Action Needed

Value will be blank if response to Lead Test in Past 12 Months is No or Unknown

If caregiver indicates Yes, lead test in the last 12 months and result is high, it is appropriate to indicate No Action Needed if being followed by health care provider and add a note in the Notes column indicating this information.



LEAD DEMONSTRATION

Local Agency & Blood Lead Screening

- Question Our agency provides blood lead testing; how would we document that?
- Answer If the blood lead test has not been completed within the past 12 months at the time of certification, mark "No" under the "Lead Test in Past 12 Months" and select "Referral Provided and Documented" in the Action column. Once your agency's lead program receives the test results, staff should add a new row in the lead grid with the updated information.


What does Provided and Documented Mean?






Referral Provided and Documented

A Referral to Lead Prevention/Screening is added on the Referrals screen, and if applicable a Community Resource is added.

HEMOGLOBIN/HEMATOCRIT SCREENING

Biochemical Assessment

Typically, anemia screening is conducted at the following timeframes. For specific requirements, refer to policy.


Infants: Between nine and twelve months if certified at 6 months or older

*Children: During the 1-year certification and annually thereafter

Women:

- Pregnant women collected at the earliest opportunity during pregnancy
- Breastfeeding and postpartum women, ideally completed 4-6 weeks after delivery

*When test results indicate anemia, a follow-up blood test is recommended at 6-month intervals until the results are in normal range.
