1. Circle all the risk factors that can be assigned to an Infant participant manually in I-WIC:
 - 103 – underweight or at risk of underweight
 - 142 – preterm or early term
 - 201 – low hemoglobin
 - 211 – elevated blood lead
 - 903- Foster Care
2. Breastfeeding infant is being watched for diagnosed jaundice. What risk factor would be generated?
3. Mom tells you her exclusively breastfed infant is fed on a strict every 3 hour schedule. What risk factor would be generated?
4. Head of Household tells you baby was recently hospitalized for failure to thrive.
 - Where would this be documented in IWIC?
 - What risk would generate?
5. Family has been making homemade infant formula because it's more "natural". What risk would be generated?
